Finance

Councillor Howlett had nothing to report.

Trails Committee

Councillor Howlett submitted minutes of meeting to be accepted at next council meeting. Volunteers will be involved in the next committee meeting. The committee is engaged in discussions with family land owners so that they are aware and part of the process. Safety and supervision issues will be discussed with all workers and volunteers. The federal MP office has been contacted regarding funding.

Recreation

Councillor Alexander reported that the recreation committee will begin planning for the Canada Day celebrations in the coming weeks.

Public Works/Planning & Development

Councillor Benoit stated that he already discussed plans for improvements on Seaside Drive and McCarthy's Lane. Many residents that Councillor Benoit spoke to are excited about the plans for their street. Plans for the end of McCarthy's Lane include a fifteen foot extension to the current waterline in order to preserve the cul-de sac pavement. There are no new home starts at this time in Kippens as well as other Bay St. George communities. Areas with snow clearing damage will be address soon.

Top soil will be ordered. Residents with concerns about snow damage to their property are asked to report this to the town office.

Fire Department

Councillor Shears reported that 14 fire fighters attended the last monthly meeting. Councillor Shears reminded residents to read the unacceptable items list on the back of the cleanup flyer.

Mayor's Report

Mayor D. Brake-Patten reminded residents about cleanup week. Mayor stated WRWM is a big nightmare and our joint council needs to meet and get control of the situation. Mayor Brake-Patten attended a meeting of the Bay St. George Concerned Citizens Committee at a resident's home as well as at the college. This is a very active citizens group and their philosophy is "it doesn't matter who is in power, we are in power".
