Mayor stated that all of council should have a copy of and familiarize themselves with the 2012 feasibility Abydoz Engineered wetland study.

Committee Reports

Public Works/Planning & Development

Deputy Mayor L. Benoit reported the town sign is now up and running and the Town Clerk Debbie Cornier has been trained on how to operate the sign.

Deputy Mayor also stated that a outside worker and an office clerk is required as soon as Possible.

Councillor Boyd declared himself in conflict and left the chambers.

Deputy Mayor Leon Benoit reported on the progress of the Sand and Salt Shed and stated he was impressed with the work that has been done. He stated that a pre-construction meeting was held, and the Acting Town Clerk was the representative for staff and himself as a contact person for the engineers he also stated it is not necessary to have other people contacting the engineers, rather if there are any questions or concerns to go through himself or staff to have it presented to the engineers.

Deputy Mayor Benoit commented on the work at the dog park and wanted to recognize a resident who volunteered, Michael LaValle, as will as several other council members.

The Mayor also thanked Dave White for cleaning graffiti off the playground equipment.

Councillor Howlett talked about the grubbing site and that it is still available to resident of Kippens, he suggested the Grubbing Area be cleaned up on an annual basis going forward.

Councillor Boyd returned to the chambers.

Recreation

Councillor Shares report that the Canada Day celebrations were cancelled by the Mayor to show respect for the indigenous children. She also committed on the importance of volunteers and thanked all volunteers that worked on the Canada day celebrations that did not take place.

Councillor Shears also reported the flag polls need replacing.

Councillor Alexander stated the backstops for the baseball field are near completion.

Fire Department

Councillor Alexander stated that the Fire Department meetings are going ahead, and the department is ready if called upon.

Finance

Councillor Howlett reported on the dog park and thanked Counselor Boyd for rolling out the pea stone.

Councillor Alexander also thanked Councillor Boyd for the work on the parking lots next to the ballfield.

Councillor Howlett thanked Darron Roberts' chartered accountant company for the work on the Audit.

The Mayor thanked the volunteers for the work they put into organizeing the Canada Day event but felt canceling the event was the right thing to do.
