- The Town of Kippens Truck was taken out of service for a few days to get some frontend work done along with brakes & tires replaced, also took the opportunity to install new Town Logo stickers. Truck is mechanically sound so we should get a few more years of use
- Now that spring is here it has been noted that there are several streets with asphalt
  issues that require more than cold patch. Staff will be doing a street survey to measure
  areas requiring
  paving and put together a cost estimate.
- 2 known out of service hydrants have been addressed and are now in service, when the weather warms up, Staff will be checking ALL hydrants for proof of operation
- Spring Clean-up; This years dates are May 9 13, 2022, the Town will be sending out flyers and posting on Facebook & Website what items will be considered acceptable and collected
- The Old Salt/Sand Yard & Grubbage pit will be leveled out as soon as ground conditions allow
- The bridge on the walking trail will be addressed as soon as ground conditions allow
